## Dear

Further to our email of 23<sup>rd</sup> December 2021 regarding your request for the following information:

The Nigerian government visited Harwell in September 1959. I am looking for information, including photographs, about this episode. The TNA catalogue mentions an ES 34 series which has no detailed breakdown of the files contained in it. The archivists there say the files have not been transferred yet.

I would be immensely grateful for your help in finding out whether this series might contain relevant files, and how to access them.

Your request has been handled as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act).

Thorough searches have been carried out to locate the information you requested and we can confirm that the Atomic Weapons Establishment (AWE) does not hold any relevant information.

Under Section 16 of the FOI Act (advice and assistance) you might find it helpful to note that any requests for information concerning Civil Nuclear Sites or Companies should be directed to the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority (NDA) via <a href="mailto:nucleus.helpdesk@nda.gov.uk">nucleus.helpdesk@nda.gov.uk</a>. You may wish to search the UKAEA holdings in The National Archives (TNA) as we identified a reference to a visit of the Nigerian Prime Minister to Harwell in 1959. The reference is DEF 369/07 or CO 369/07.

If you are still unhappy after an internal review has been completed, under the provisions of Section 50 of the Freedom of Information Act 2000 you have the right to take your complaint to the Information Commissioner's Office.
