Further to our previous correspondence regarding your request for the following information:

I would like to make a Freedom of Information request to establish what information, if any, your organisation holds on Operation Pied Piper, which took place during Operation Grapple nuclear testing in 1958 at Christmas Island.

I anticipate this will include, but not be limited to, planning documents, radiological monitoring, and health physics communications, and references to at least three different categories of personnel.

Your request has been handled as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act).

A search for the requested information within the Atomic Weapons Establishment (AWE) to determine what information on Pied Piper at the Grapple Y and the Grapple Z series of tests taking place in 1958 off Christmas Island has now been completed, and we can confirm that information in scope of your request is held.
