Dear ,

Further to our previous correspondence regarding your request for the following information:

- 1. Confirmation (YES/NO) of whether AWE holds records about blood or urine testing of servicemen who were deployed, due to be deployed, or had recently been deployed, at atmospheric nuclear weapons testing and subsequent clean-ups between 1952 and 1967;
- 2. Whether these records are about the requirement to test, process of testing, or the results of testing;
- 3. The security classification and format (eg paper, digital, microfiche) of this documentation;
- 4. What records, if any, AWE holds of documents that can be described as Army Form 20 or 21; F Med 4, 7, 12 or 29;

Your request has been handled as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act).

A search for the requested information within the Atomic Weapons Establishment (AWE) has now been complete, and we will answer each question in turn:

1. Confirmation (YES/NO) of whether AWE holds records about blood or urine testing of servicemen who were deployed, due to be deployed, or had recently been deployed, at atmospheric nuclear weapons testing and subsequent clean-ups between 1952 and 1967;

We have repeated our searches and have not located any new information. 2. Whether these records are about the requirement to test, process of testing, or the results of testing;

This is not a question under the FoI regime, however, under Section 16, the duty of a public authority to provide advice and assistance, we can suggest that one document refers to the requirement to test, and the second provides a set of blood test results.

- 3. The security classification and format (eg paper, digital, microfiche) of this documentation; These are digitised documents and classified 'Official'.
- 4. What records, if any, AWE holds of documents that can be described as Army Form 20 or 21; F Med 4, 7, 12 or 29;

We have searched our databases for the following: Army Form 20 or 21; F Med 4, 7, 12 or 29 and can confirm a nil return, no documents were located at this time using this search criteria. Presume no information held.
