Your request has been handled as a request for information under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the Act).

We can confirm that AWE holds all of the information in scope of your request.

However, we are witholding some of the information under section 40(2) of that act in order to protect personal information as governed by the Data Protection Act 2018. This information has been redacted from the documents attached.

Section 40(2) requires the Department to conduct a balancing exercise which involves balancing the rights and interests of individuals against the legitimate interests in disclosure. This is not the same as carrying out the public interest test associated with certain exemptions under the Act. The balancing exercise is carried out in order to decide whether the absolute exemption in section 40(2) is engaged. In particular, there is no assumption of disclosure in the legitimate interest's test, as there is with qualified exemptions. The outcome of the balancing exercise lay in withholding the third-party personal data identified as being within scope of your request.

t. atill is not recling very well and his blood count is slightly abnormal. Confirmatory blood counts and specialist physician advice are being obtained prior to any further radiological duties by this N.C.O.

 Meanwhile, many Xrsys have to be conducted at Brisbane or Greenslopes Hospital with consequent serious loss of man hours.

3. It is agreed by Base Squadron Commander that provision of a separate crash ward of the type now reserved, is unnecessary following cessation of Lincoln flying at this Base. All operational gireraft at this Base now only have a crew of two.

4. A review of the current crash ward with a view to its conversion to a radiological section was therefore done, and it is considered that this area will be very suitable from all points of view, and that only minor modifications of structure will be required. An A.9 is therefore being raised to effect this and it is requested that this matter be regarded as an urgent necessity if radiological service is to be continued at this Base.

5. This proposed site will meet the space and ventilation requirements of A.B.O. "A" 141/55, and an air conditioning system will not be necessary. Ventilation fan systems will be required for the proposed new dark room.

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

1. The following is a summary of the work carried but by the above Section during the month May 1956.

Improvements.

On 14th May 1956, a leboratory was established at B.S.Q. Amberley in a small room adjacent to the S.M.O's. office, as this room was much too small for an efficient Laboratory, another room was made available at the rear of the Base Sick Quarters. The initial work of clearing this new toom of a considerable amount of stored Medical equipment was completed later in the week.

Arrangements were made with 7 S.D. for any laboratory equipment held in their "R" design. An electric Beteriel Incubator, an Analytical Balance and weight, and a considerable amount of graduated and volumetric management were detailed. A high speed electric Cantificum to hold a test tubes is an atrangth.

An initial demand has been made to 18.D. for the balance of equipment required to satablish most of the branches of Pathelogy precedures.

Tests available at the present are - Full Blood
Estimations, Brythrocyte Sedimentation Rates, Micro Urines, Urinary
Spoblingen, Occult Blood, Bacterial Smears.

There are numerous improvements required in the present laboratory, which was used originally as a V.D. Prophylaxis Room. New power points, shelves, cupboards and the installation of a sink and draining board are planned to be fitted in due course.
